Health Reform, Cost Control and the Fate of Children With Life-altering Illnesses

2017 Pediatric Bioethics Day

Wednesday, Sept. 20, 2017

TARGET AUDIENCE

This activity is intended for physicians, nurses, social workers, chaplains, therapists, members of hospital ethics committees and other health care providers. Providers in pediatric and adult care settings are encouraged to attend.

STATEMENT OF EDUCATIONAL NEED

Recent debate in Congress over the American Health Care Act has raised questions about future health care coverage for low-income children who are U.S. citizens as well as children who are undocumented immigrants. Pediatric health care providers and hospital support staff need to be up to date on these critical debates, and should be encouraged to engage in public discourse on the important health care needs of children. The impact federal health insurance policies have on patients and the potential future impact of proposed health care policy revisions will be discussed.

FORMAT

This lecture and discussion will provide health care professionals with current updates on health care policies and their implications. To facilitate access to this content across Norton Healthcare's campuses, the lecture will be provided twice. A "Breakfast and Learn" session at the Norton Healthcare – St. Matthews campus will be followed by an identical "Lunch and Learn" session at Norton Hospital in downtown Louisville.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Identify seven different conceptions of health care justice and their roles in fairly addressing just health care cost control in relation to life-altering illnesses in children.
2. Distinguish in ethically relevant ways the just claims to health care for children with serious but treatable conditions compared to children whose conditions are fatal.

3. Critically assess from a health care justice perspective the likely effects a repeal of the Affordable Care Act would have on children with life-altering illnesses.
4. Propose policy options at the federal and institutional levels for more fairly addressing the health care needs of children with life-altering illnesses.
